Dear Friends in Christ,

In this weekend's gospel the Lord talks to us about prayer. Here is what Fr. Cornelius Lapide, SJ, tells us about this gospel passage: "Behold how great is the dignity, the need, and the power of prayer. The need, that by it we may be delivered from all the temptations and tribulations by which we are every where, and always, surrounded. The dignity, because by means of prayer we converse with God, as do the angels. The power, because by it we overcome all adversities and hardships. "To pray always," says St. [John] Chrysostom (Book ii. of Prayer) "is the work of angels, who, wholly intent upon God, teach us while we pray ... to have no regard to things present, but to conceive of ourselves as standing in the midst of angels, and performing the same sacrifice with them." He adds, "Satan does not venture to come too near to a soul fortified by prayer, for he fears the strength and fortitude

which prayer confers. Prayer supports the soul more than food supports the body. "And (Book i.), "As the sun gives light to the body, so does prayer to the soul." (*The Great Commentary*, Fr. Cornelius à Lapide)

We must speak to our Heavenly Father, and the Blessed Mother, our heavenly mother. Through the Rosary, through praying the Mass, through our own interior conversation with them in our soul. This can be done throughout the day, but most especially in scheduled time of prayer and silence.

Why do our trials, tribulations and sufferings not go away when we pray? This is often prayer of petition, meaning we are asking

God for some favor or some request.

God always gives us what we ask, or something better. The "something better" might not be what we think seems better. Sometimes the trials we face in life God might use to bring us to greater holiness. Although these sufferings we face are evil in and of themselves, God might use them for good. Think of Jesus Himself and His suffering or that of His Blessed Mother that led to our salvation. This might not make sense entirely to us. It takes a lot of faith to trust God is leading us to goodness in the middle of sufferings and to be able to see this. If we read the saints, we see how much suffering they faced and how they accepted it joyfully. We might wonder how they could have such joy in the face of that suffering. This is where we must pray asking for grace to have patience and long-suffering (gifts of the Holy Spirit) and trust. We cannot get through such sufferings alone without the help of interior grace and prayer. This is why our gospel speaks about the necessity to pray always. The woman in the gospel is persistent in the face of what seems like an impossible situation. This is probably why the Lord gave to St. Faustina that image of Himself, the "Divine Mercy" image with the words "Jesus. I trust in You" at the bottom.

Let us trust the Lord, that He can bring great good even out of impossible circumstances.




