

Dear Parishioners,

How do we define whether one is rich or poor? Typically, we seek out the obvious things; money, what they are wearing, what they drive and how they conduct themselves. We recognize that these are not proper ways of obtaining the truth, nor is it what the Gospel defines as rich. Our Gospel acclamation states Jesus was rich and became poor so that we might become rich. We remember that Jesus was God, but also man. Jesus came to us so that He could be like us in all things but sin, pain, suffering, and happiness. If you remember last week in the Gospel, we heard a series of parables or stories if you will: the Parable of the Lost Sheep, Parable of the Lost Coin, and the Parable of the Prodigal Son, the primary focus being, God's Mercy for His people.

This week we focus on accountability in our own lives. We recognize that in our lives, there are consequences for our actions both positive and negative. As a young person. if we don't do as our parents say, we might get grounded or maybe, we do well in school or something good around the house, then we are rewarded. As an adult, if we bypass the law, serious consequences are a realty. If we do something well at work, it could present itself in the way of a promotion. Our readings warn us and call us to look at our own lives and consider any consequences, but also positive actions that we make.

As I said: last week we were shown the mercy of the Father, now this week we are being challenged to hold our end of the bargain. Let's face it, there are so many things in our daily lives that compete for our attention. It's easy to get caught up in all the chaos of our daily lives that we don't often see the many things that God puts before us. In the Gospel, we are given many responsibilities in both our daily lives as well as in our faith lives. How will you look at the responsibilities in your own lives this week and use them to better your own life?


