
OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILDOur Parish will once again be participating in

Dear Parishioners,

Where do we go to experience God? For most of us we would say we come to the church to receive God either in the Eucharist or to just pray. Some would say they can talk to God in prayer and experience Him in that way. For many, they can experience God in the most simple of places, but we must be open and inviting to that experience. We hear in our responsorial psalm this weekend "The Lord hears the cry of the poor". Likewise in 2nd Timothy, we hear St. Paul speaking about how he has experienced God and how God has walked with him on the journey.

Experiencing God doesn't have to be a life altering moment. At times, people often think that God can only be experienced in those moments, but in reality God is all around us each day of our lives. He is with us in those moments when we don't think He is there, and He is with us to celebrate those victories in our own lives. How have you experienced God in the last few days? This is a quest ion we should be asking ourselves on a daily basis.

In the Gospel, we hear a parable of a tax collector and a pharisee. The pharisee prays to himself thanking God that he is not like the rest of humanity, greedy, dishonest, adulterous, or even like the tax collector. The tax collector stands off at a distance without raising his eyes to heaven and prays. "O God be merciful to me. a sinner". We see an act of humility in the tax collector while the pharisee prays to himself and points out everyone else's flaws except his own. It is easy to see others faults, but we must recognize our own so that we can begin to change our hearts to experience God.

Take some time this week to experience God in your own way. Whether it is getting out and seeing God in nature, spend a few moments in prayer at home, or taking a little while in Adoration on Tuesday mornings. The Lord will hear our cry when we need Him. Likewise, He will walk with us and help us make our decisions, so long as we invite Him in. How will you invite God into your heart this week?


