

Dear Parishioners,

As of the end of this past week, there have been no leads regarding the theft that occurred at St. Joseph's June 11. I will keep everyone posted with any leads or information that I receive. I met with our Trustees Gerry Ritter and Sue Alger, this past Tuesday to review and update how the handling of the collection will be in the future. We have invested in cameras around the property to monitor the outside areas of the church and our property. The church will remain locked overnight and open from 7AM until 3PM.

This week's gospel passage is a powerful reminder of the importance of trust and faith in God, especially in times of difficulty and persecution.

Jesus is preparing His disciples for their upcoming mission to spread the gospel, and He emphasizes the need for them to be bold and courageous in their proclamation of the truth. He tells them not to be afraid of those who oppose them or threaten them, but to trust in God's protection and provision.

In our own lives, we may face opposition or persecution for our faith. It can be tempting to remain silent or hide our beliefs to avoid conflict or criticism. However, Jesus reminds us that we should not be ashamed of our faith and that we should boldly proclaim the truth, even when it is difficult. Jesus tells us that we should not fear those who can harm our bodies, but rather we should fear God who has power over both our bodies and our souls.
