Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we welcome Sr. Barbara Bartkowiak OSF for our annual Diocesan Mission. Sister will speak on behalf of the St. Elizabeth Society which supports the ministry of the Franciscans of Allegheny to those in most need in parts of Brazil. Bolivia, Jamaica, Mozambique, and the US.

Our Responsorial Psalm this weekend comes from Psalm 138. It is a beautiful expression of gratitude and praise to God. As we delve into verses 1-3, 6, and 8, we find a heartfelt reflection on the goodness, faithfulness, and power of God, combined with the psalmist's personal experiences and unwavering trust. Verse 1 begins with a declaration of wholehearted praise, stating, "I will give you thanks with all my heart." This shows the psalmist's genuine and sincere gratitude towards God, leaving no room for halfheartedness. It sets the tone for the entire psalm, emphasizing the psalmist's deep reverence and love for God. In verse 2, we witness the psalmist's recognition of God's faithfulness to His promises. The psalmist acknowledges that God's word and His name have been exalted above all things, reiterating the trustworthiness and reliability of God's character. This acknowledgment serves as a reminder to us that we can always rely on God's steadfast love and faithfulness in our own lives.

Moving on to verse 3, we see the psalmist's humble recognition of answered prayers. The psalmist testifies that when they called upon God, He answered and strengthened their soul. This verse reminds us of the power of prayer and the assurance that God hears and responds to our cries for help, providing us with the strength we need to face any challenges we may encounter. Verse 6 highlights God's sovereignty and the recognition that He cares for the humble. The psalmist acknowledges that though God is exalted and transcendent, He still looks upon and cares for the lowly and the humble. It serves as a comforting reminder that no matter our circumstances, God is always attentive to our needs and is ready to extend His grace and love. Verse 8 concludes the psalm with a plea for God's continued faithfulness and guidance. The psalmist asks God not to abandon the work of His hands, recognizing that it is through His divine guidance and protection that they can continue to walk in His ways.

Psalm 138 beautifully encapsulates the psalmist's deep gratitude, trust, and reliance on God. It reminds us of the importance of wholehearted praise, recognizing God's faithfulness, and seeking His guidance in our lives. May we also find solace and inspiration in these words, as we navigate our own journeys of faith.
