Dear Parishioners,

I want to give everyone an update on where we stand on our Hope Appeal. Currently between gifts and pledges, we have raised \$12,804 dollars of our 18,175.00 dollar goal. I will remind everyone that whatever amount we go over, we will receive 100 percent of that back to the parish. This is a great opportunity to be able to help those in need as we hear in our Gospel this weekend.

This weekend we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe. We are reminded of the profound truth that Jesus Christ is the ultimate ruler of the universe, both in heaven and on earth. This feast is always celebrated on the last Sunday of ordinary time and marks the end of our liturgical year. This weekend our readings invite us to contemplate the sovereignty and majesty of Christ. At the heart of Christ's kingship is his selfless love and sacrifice. Unlike earthly kings who seek power and control, Jesus reigns through humility and service. He demonstrated this through his birth in a lowly stable, his ministry of healing and mercy, and ultimately, his death on the cross for the redemption of humanity.
