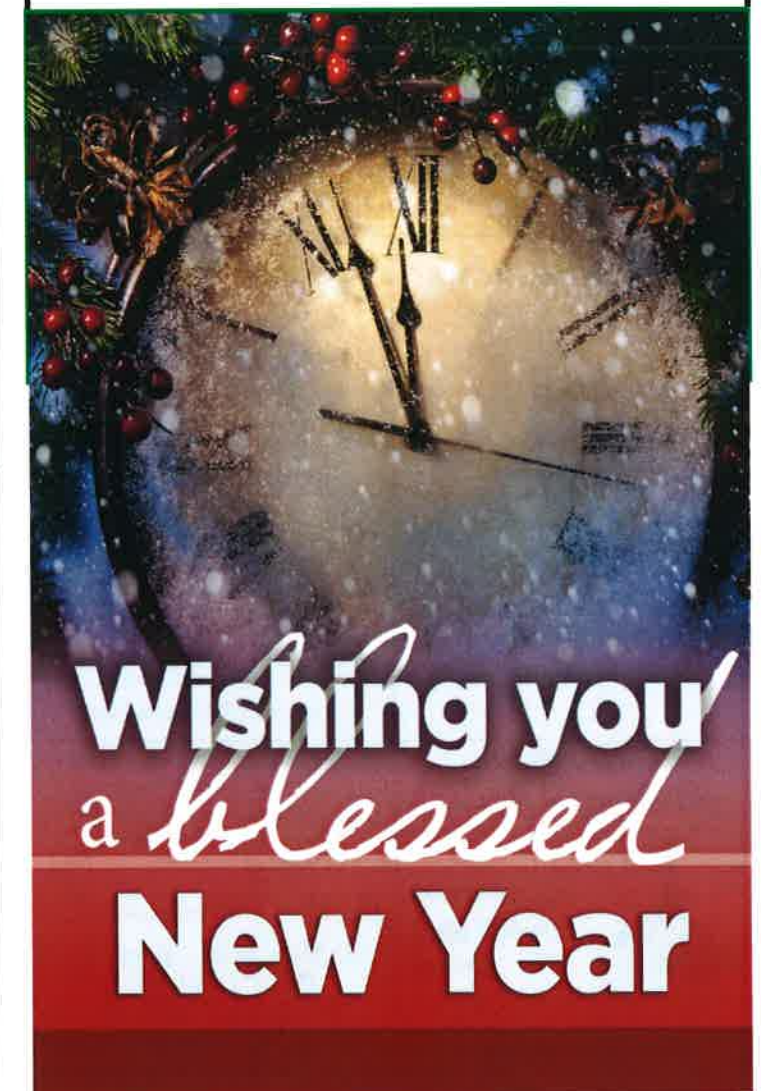
Food Pantry Corner

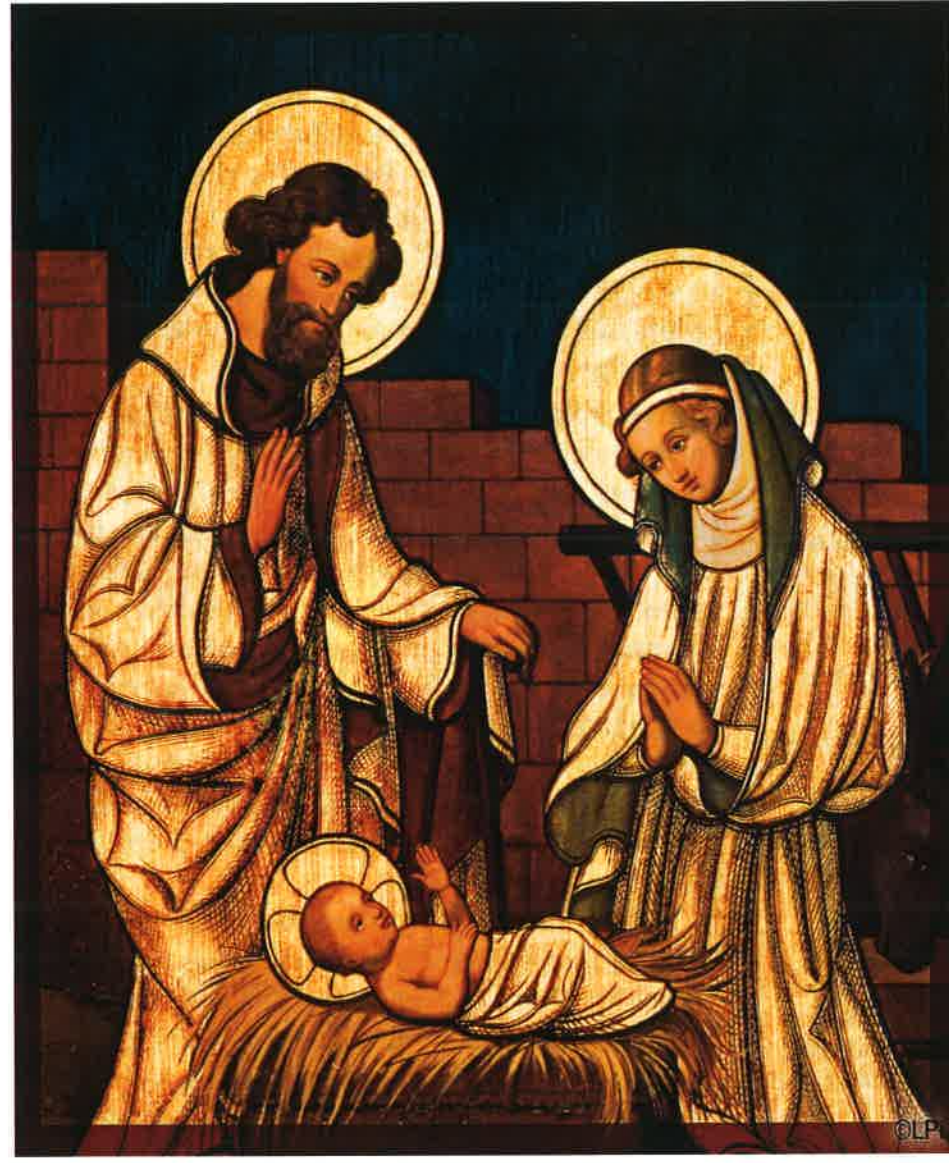
