The Feast of the Epiphany commemorates the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus. It is



observed on January 6th, twelve days after Christmas. This feast holds great importance and provides a moment for reflection on various aspects. The story of the Magi's journey to find Jesus reminds us of the universal nature of Christ's message. The Magi came from the East, representing the Gentile world, to pay homage to the newborn King. Their presence at the manger signifies that Jesus came for all people, regardless of their nationality, race, or social status. It serves as a reminder to embrace inclusivity and welcome all with open arms. The gifts presented by the Magi - gold, frankincense, and myrrh hold symbolic meaning as well. Gold represents Jesus' kingship, frankincense signifies his divinity, and myrrh foreshadows his sacrificial death.

The Epiphany teaches us about the importance of faith and obedience. The Magi followed the star and trusted in its guidance, even though they did not fully understand its meaning. They were willing to embark on a long and challenging journey to find the newborn King. Their faith and obedience serve as an example for us to trust in God's divine plan, even when the path is uncertain or difficult.

This weekends' Feast of the Epiphany offers a time for reflection on the universal nature of Christ's message, the symbolic gifts of the Magi, the theme of revelation, and the importance of faith and obedience. It calls us to embrace inclusivity, offer our gifts to serve others, seek divine revelation, and trust in God's guidance. It is a celebration that reminds us of the significance of Jesus' birth and encourages us to deepen our faith and commitment to following him. How will you more closely follow Christ this week?




