

Our Gospel this week, is taken from Mark 9:2-10. This passage recounts the transfiguration of Jesus on a high mountain in the



presence of Peter, James, and John. This significant event illuminates Jesus' divinity and serves as a pivotal moment in his ministry. The transfiguration reveals Jesus' glory, as his face shines like the sun and his clothes become dazzling white, symbolizing his heavenly nature and the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. The presence of Moses and Elijah conversing with Jesus underscores the continuity between the Old Testament prophecies and Jesus' ministry, highlighting his role as the fulfillment of the Scriptures. Peter's response, expressing the desire to build shelters for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah, reflects the disciples' awe and attempts to comprehend the divine mystery unfolding before them. This is significant as the disciples, through much of the Gospel struggle with comprehending who Jesus is. Even when Jesus asks them "who do you say that I am?' Peter is the only one who responds with.

"The Christ the Son of the Living God."

As we hear God's voice from the cloud affirming Jesus as his Son this echoes the baptism of Jesus, emphasizing his identity and mission as the beloved Son of God. The command to listen to Jesus directs the disciples, and us, to pay attention to Jesus' teachings and follow his example of love, compassion, and self-sacrifice. The transfiguration serves as a revelation of Jesus' identity, a confirmation of his divine nature, and a foretaste of the glory to come. It challenges us to reflect on our understanding of Jesus, to deepen our faith, and to listen to his words as the ultimate source of truth and guidance in our lives. How will we identify Christ in our spiritual Journey during this Lenten season?

PRAY THE ROSARY DURING LENT




