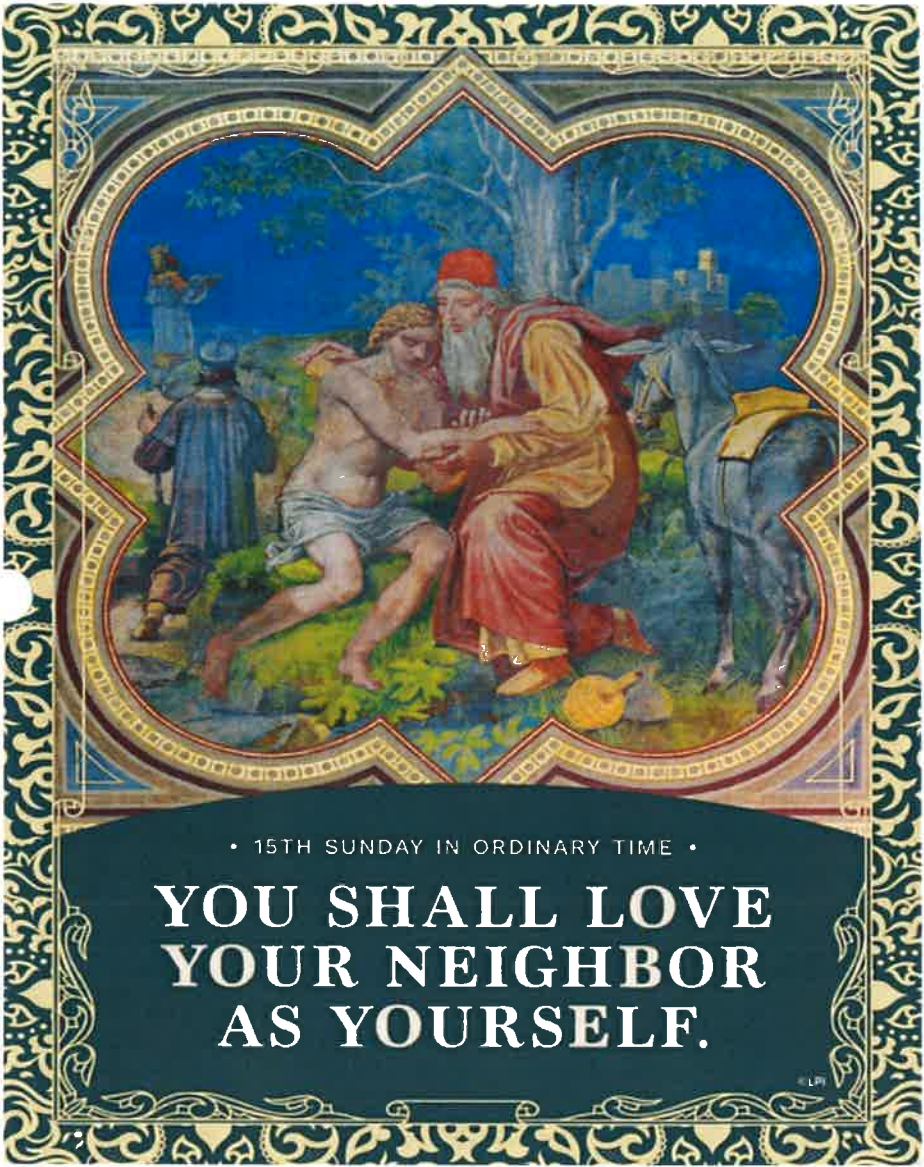

May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of Evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally.

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.

May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever. Amen

Dear Parishioners,



Bibiana (my goldendoodle) and I are getting settled in. I am grateful for the warm welcome we have both received. I wish to draw your attention to the daily mass and prayer schedule which will go into effect on Monday. Please note that the daily mass time at St. Joseph will be every weekday at 7:30 am. I will keep the 8:30 am mass at St. Patrick Church on Wednesdays.

Also, as mentioned before, we will have a holy hour every weekday evening, beginning at 6:00 pm. This will include Exposition, Adoration, Confession, Evening Prayer (I use the ibreviary app) and conclude with Benediction. Unless we have a Holy Day of Obligation, none of these times for mass or prayer are obligatory. Folks are invited to participate as often as they wish.

In the Gospel this weekend we hear Jesus speak of "A man [who] fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho." Our Lord tells us of the Samaritan traveler who cared for him: He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Whenever we hear of water, oil, bread and wine mentioned in the Scriptures, we should immediately think of the power and efficacy of the sacraments.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains: "Adhering to the teaching of the Holy Scriptures, to the apostolic traditions, and to the consensus . . . of the Fathers," we profess that "the sacraments of the new law were . . . all instituted by Jesus Christ our Lord." . . . The mysteries of Christ's life are the foundations of what he would henceforth dispense in the sacraments, through the ministers of his Church, for "what was visible in our Savior has passed over into his mysteries." Sacraments are "powers that comes forth" from the Body of Christ, which is ever-living and life-giving. They are actions of the Holy Spirit at work in his Body, the Church. They are "the masterworks of God" in the new and everlasting covenant. (CCC, #1114-1116)

Thus, the story of the Samaritan traveler anticipates the power of the sacraments of Holy Communion (the wine) and the Anointing of the Sick (the oil). As your pastor, it is my obligation to love and serve you through the celebration of the liturgy and the Sacraments. It is for this reason that I have added to the liturgical celebrations that will be taking place daily. Again, the Catechism speaks of this obligation: The ordained priesthood guarantees that it really is Christ who acts in the sacraments through the Holy Spirit for the Church. The saving mission entrusted by the Father to his incarnate Son was committed to the apostles and through them to their successors: they receive the Spirit of Jesus to act in his name and in his person. The ordained minister is the sacramental bond that ties the liturgical action to what the apostles said and did and, through them, to the words and actions of Christ, the source and foundation of the sacraments. (CCC, #1120)

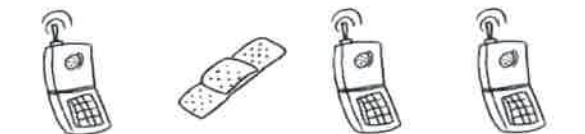
