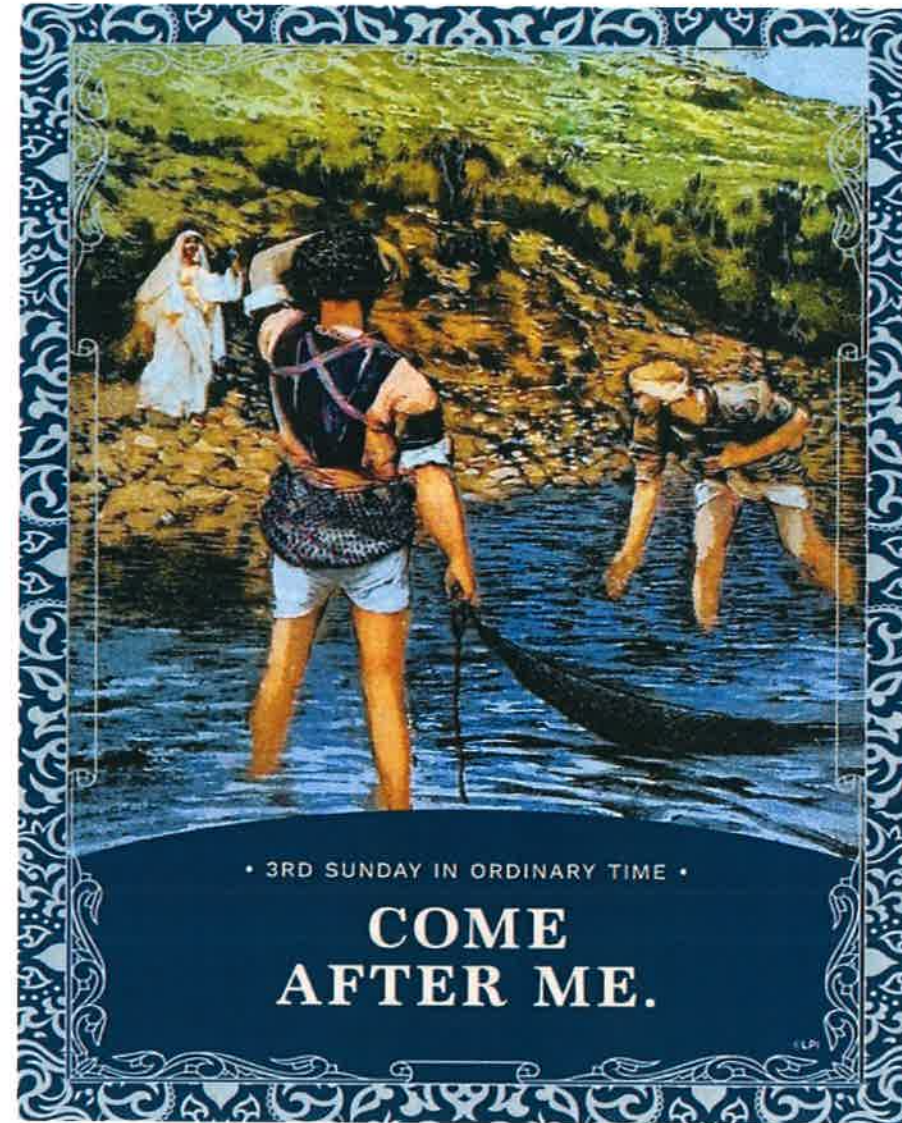

Dear Friends in Christ,



In the past, we have reflected on what it means for the Church to be Catholic or universal. We are mindful of the four marks of the Church that are mentioned when we proclaim together, at mass, the Nicene Creed: I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. The Second Reading this weekend invites us to focus on what it means for the Church to be One: I urge you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose.

We should be mindful of the prayer Jesus offers during The Last Supper Discourse: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are [one]." ... "I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:11,20-21)

The oneness of the Church is to be experienced at multiple levels. The whole of the universal Church and all of its members should strive to be one in truth, love and faith. This oneness derives from the unity of the Holy Trinity. It is also the fruit of having been made one in Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains:

The Church is one because of her source: "the highest exemplar and source of this mystery is the unity, in the Trinity of Persons, of one God, the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit." The Church is one because of her founder: for "the Word made flesh, the prince of peace, reconciled all men to God by the cross, . . . restoring the unity of all in one people and one body." The Church is one because of her "soul": "It is the Holy Spirit, dwelling in those who believe and pervading and ruling over the entire Church, who brings about that wonderful communion of the faithful and joins them together so intimately in Christ that he is the principle of the Church's unity." Unity is of the essence of the Church. (CCC, #813)

There is a oneness as well that can be experienced by all believers. Here, we are speaking of oneness of heart that is brought about by the forgiveness of sins. Sin separates from God; Adam and Eve were kicked out of the Garden. It also divides us from one-another. On the other hand, the effect of grace and mercy in our lives brings unity to the whole Church, to every diocese, parish and even every family.

The Eucharist, which is also called Holy Communion, is a constant invitation to be made one in Christ: ...if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. (Matthew 5:23-24)
